

LIVING PROPHETICALLY

"I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their own people; I will put my words in the mouth of the prophet, who shall speak to them everything that I command" (Deuteronomy 18:18). Through these words, Moses pointed to the coming of Jesus Christ who is not only a prophet but is above all the prophets. Jesus Christ is God and He is indeed the fulfillment of the prophecies as He Himself once testified in the Synagogue when He read from the scroll of Isaiah, one of the greatest prophets. We read that, "When He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up, He went to the Synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was His custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to Him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, Because He anointed me to preach the Gospel to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are downtrodden, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. Then He began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:16-19.21). God is the One who provides the prophets for His people as indeed Moses tells the Israelites. God gives them the message to take to the people and so the prophet is not only the one who foretells the future but He is also one who speaks in the name of God. By speaking in the name of God, the prophet speaks the saving message of God.

In the Gospel, Jesus Christ who lives the prophetic ministry speaks the saving word that saves the suffering man. He says, "Be silent,

Moses said to the people: Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said, "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to

me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die.

This is the word of the Lord.

the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord. This is the word of the Lord.

GOSPEL

"He taught them with authority."

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 1:21-28

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so aston-

ished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

come out of Him" (Mark 1:25). This word leads to the deliverance of the formerly possessed man who is set free from the bonds of the evil one. The people recognize the special power at work in Jesus Christ and so they say, "What is this? A new teaching - with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey Him" (Mark 1:27). The authority of Jesus Christ does not mean using force but rather the working of divine power in Him. It means that Jesus belongs to His own message and His own message belongs to Him. There is no contradiction between what He says, what He does and who He is. This is the

authority that was lacking in the rabbis and (perhaps) also (sometimes) lacks in our lives. In following Jesus Christ, let us strive to pattern our actions to the words we speak otherwise we shall hear Isaiah telling us, "these people draw near with their mouths and honor me with their lips, while their hearts are far from me, and their worship of me is a human commandment which they have simply memorized" (Isaiah 29:13).

From the teaching of the Church, we learn that the Sacrament of Baptism makes us prophets, priests and kings as Jesus Christ was Prophet, Priest and King. The prophet teaches, the priest sanctifies and the king governs. One of the basic ways, therefore, of living our Baptism is by living prophetically. This means passing on the message of God and we can do this by preaching and our good exemplary life.

In our Christian life, let us be aware that being a prophet is not only telling the future but being the spokesperson of God. In our time, let us strive to use the present means of social communication (whatsapp, tweeter, instagram, emails) to bring the message of healing, love and hope to the people.

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
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
