“PEACE. BE STILL”

Peace. Be still” (Mark 4:39) are the words of Jesus Christ that He addresses to the stormy sea. Four of the Apostles of Jesus Christ, namely, Peter, Andrew, James and John had been fishermen before being called by Jesus Christ (Mark 1:14-20). Despite their experience as far as the life of the lake was concerned, none of them and indeed no human being could or can speak to the sea to calm down and it calms down. Human knowledge, human experience and professionalism are all good and desirable once rightly achieved but they too have their own limitations beyond which they cannot go. Only God is The Almighty. Only God is The All-Powerful. He is the One who sets limits even to the sea as we have it today in the first reading that, “So far and no farther! Here your powerful waves must stop” (Job 38:11). He is only God who says to the troubled, stormy sea, “Peace. Be still” (Mark 4:39).

The Apostles were blessed to have Jesus Christ in the boat. It was night and Jesus, perhaps, fatigued by the ministry during

SECOND READING

“Now the new creation is here.”

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 5:14-17

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here. *This is the word of the Lord*

“Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.”

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 4:35-41

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, ‘Let us cross over to the other side.’ And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, ‘Master, do you not care? We are going down!’ And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, ‘Quiet now! Be calm!’ And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, ‘Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?’ They were filled with awe and said to one another, ‘Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.’

course of the sailing, there have been, there are and there will be storms but God helps the Church not to sink.

In our Christian life, we go through various storms. These can be spiritual, financial, social, at our places of work and in other aspects of our life. In all these, we pray that Jesus Christ may say to each and every troubled soul, “Peace. Be still” (Mark 4:39).

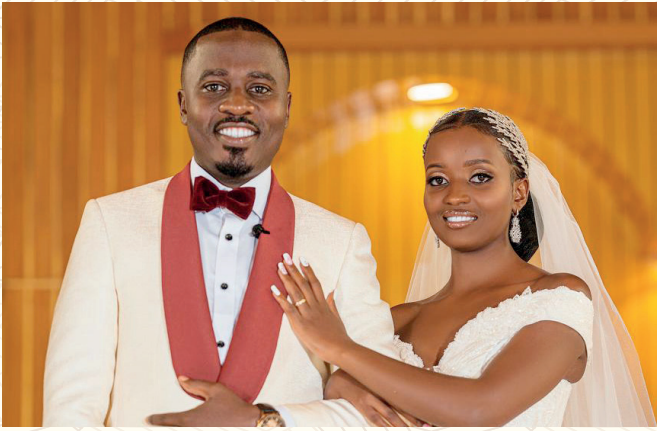
